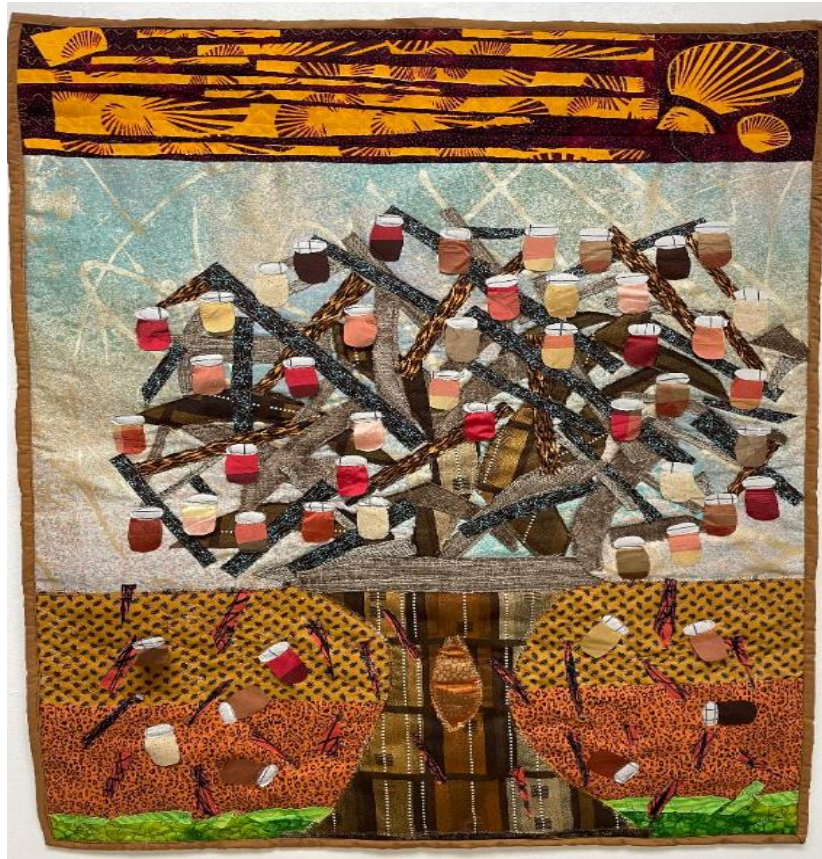

The **Remembrance Quilt** was designed by Ms. Pamela Edwards, a quilter from the Hannibal Square Heritage Center in Winter Park, FL. As stated in an exclusive interview with Ms. Mary Allen, CEO of the African American Museum of the Arts, Inc., Ms. Edwards states she was initially inspired by the social unrest in this country, followed by several conversations with her dear friends. "What really got my attention was viewing a documentary about Brian Stevenson and seeing him digging up soil and placing it in jars. That really intrigued me. Then, after watching the movie *Just Mercy*, I knew I had to do something. You know at that time, I had no knowledge of the Legacy Museum in Montgomery, Alabama." Once the chairs of Volusia Remembers Coalition saw the quilt...we knew we had to have it... it spoke volumes to our work and mission; therefore VRC members were honored to commission Ms. Edwards to make a duplicate Remembrance Quilt.

TWO NEGROES LYNNED.
Assaulted a Little Girl and Confessed Their Crime.

DELAND, Fla., Sept. 26.—For criminally assaulting little Eva Bruce, Charles Harris and Anthony Johnson were lynched Thursday night in the southern portion of this county, near the Brevard line. The men were negroes, and their victim is the seven-year-old daughter of James D. Bruce, a railroad contractor, who lives near Maytown.

Thursday afternoon the little girl went out to gather palmetto berries. She did not return as soon as expected and when search was made she was found unresponsive in the woods, about two miles from home.

When the girls and recovered relatives to the woods by Charles Harris and Anthony Johnson, employees of her father, and there cruelly treated.
